Blessed are those who are persecuted because of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

Group Session

Opening Question

Have you ever been ridiculed for being a Christian or taking a stand based on your beliefs? Tell about that time.

Discussing the Scripture & Life

- 1. Les said that one of the reasons people persecute us is that our righteousness may convict them as they compare their lives to ours. What ways can we minimize the resentment someone may feel toward us?
- 2. The bottom line of the sermon is this: "The changes God makes in my life can be permanent, but they aren't automatic, and they will have consequences." When we signed on to being a disciple, did we realize that there would be negative consequences to following Christ? Other than being ridiculed, what other negatives have you experienced in the Christian life?
- 3. Read the following passage from Matthew 13:44-45. Do you see any application here to persecution? (Being part of the kingdom is worth trading everything else for.)

⁴⁴"The kingdom of heaven is like treasure hidden in a field. When a man found it, he hid it again, and then in his joy went and sold all he had and bought that field.

⁴⁵"Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a merchant looking for fine pearls. ⁴⁶When he found one of great value, he went away and sold everything he had and bought it.

4. Suffering in the following forms of persecution are happening all around the world, but seldom in our country. Pause and thank God for our freedom, but chose a country in which you are familiar with persecution and pray for believers there.

Pray for those who are: Ostracized by family

Imprisoned

Suffer physical abuse

Murdered (pray for families)

Also pray for believers who have willingly chosen to live in these countries, whether as official or unofficial missionaries, to make an impact for the kingdom.

 - * Find a way to rejoice.
 - * Keep suffering in perspective.
 - * Show compassion to others.
- 6. Read these verses. Which of these help you keep suffering or persecution in perspective?
