## Group Session

### Opening Questions

What were your thoughts when hearing the number of orphaned children both in the world and in the U.S.?

\*143 million children are orphans worldwide

\* every year 12 million become orphaned

\*In the US, over 500,000 in the US in foster care

\*every year 25,000 age out of the foster system.

### Discussing the Scripture & Life

1. What does it mean to say that we were all spiritual orphans at one point?
2. How did Jesus become an orphan on the cross?
3. Do you have any stories about how your children have copied you? What keeps us from imitating our spiritual Father more?

If we are more like the father, what concerns Him will concern us.

4. Do you know someone who has been adopted or a family that has adopted? How has it been a blessing to them?
5. What are your thoughts on the church emphasizing adoption? Is this part of the mission of the church? How could this benefit the kingdom of God?
