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If Money Could Talk: “Don’t Cling to Me!”

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Series: If Money Could Talk

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Scripture

1 Peter 1:14-15

As obedient children, do not conform to the evil desires you had when you lived in ignorance. But just as He who called you is holy, so be holy in all you do.

Engage

What is some of the dumbest financial planning that you have ever seen? (By the way, 75% of ex-professional football players later file for bankruptcy.)

Discuss

1. Read the passage and discuss these questions:
 - a. Should this passage apply to our finances?
 - b. How can we apply this to our finances?
2. Do you believe that a person manages his or her money better when they have more? Why or why not? What does that say about how we are living today? (It’s not a matter of the amount, it’s a matter of the heart. If we don’t handle a little well, we won’t handle a lot well.)
3. Where do people struggle most with the following formula for financial management?
 - a. Give.
 - b. Save.
 - c. Live on the rest.
4. Being upside down is not the root of a problem, it’s the fruit of a problem. What does it mean? Do you agree with that?

5. Chuck Bentley of Crown Financial Ministries said, “A wise and faithful steward is one who orders their life and finances in such a way that God can spend you however he wants to spend you.”

What does this quote communicate about the stewardship of our lives? (That we are here to be spent by God. The world doesn’t revolve around us.)

6. Here are some wise practices in dealing with our finances. Which do you think most people struggle with?
- Establish a realistic plan and stick to it.
 - Give to God first.
 - Live on less than you make.
 - Get out of debt as soon as possible.
 - Save regularly.
 - Invest wisely for the long term.
7. True or false: “The pain of the payments usually exceeds the pleasure of the purchase.” Tell about a time you’ve learned about this.
